Bee's Jubilee	\$14.99 10-14' tall / Blooms May-June & Aug. / Pruning group 2. Non-fading, 7-8" blooms of light pink with a dark pink stripe though each overlapping petal. Yellow anthers.
Bourbon	\$14.99 8-10' tall / Blooms June-Early Aug./ Pruning group 2. Rounded vibrant fuchsia-red flowers to 5-6" across. Yellow anthers.
Cardinal Wysznski	\$14.99 6' tall / Blooms June & September./ Pruning group 2. 6-8" crimson-fuchsia blooms with dark anthers on a vigorous plant.
Comtesse de Bouchard	\$14.99 8-12' tall / Blooms June, July & Sept. / Pruning group 3. Velvet rose-pink flowers to 7" across. One of the best pinks, with good flower form.
Crystal Fountain	\$14.99 5-7' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 2. Early 4-5" blooms of lilac blue and a fountain-like center. Compact and very free-blooming.
Diana's Delight	\$14.99 6' tall / Blooms May-September / Pruning Group 2. Rich lavender-blue blooms to 6" across have darker and lighter shades of blue, creamy yellow anthers.
Dr. Ruppel	\$14.99 10-12' tall / Blooms May-June & September / Pruning Group 2. Pinkish lavender petals w/rose colored center bar.
Duchess of Edinburg	\$14.99 10-12' tall / Blooms May-June & Sept. / Pruning group 2. Rosette shaped double white flowers with yellow anthers. Blooms are up to 6" across. Very strong grower.
Edda	\$14.99 3-4' tall / Blooms May-September / Pruning group 3. 5" blue blooms with a magenta stripe through each overlapping pointed petal. Very free blooming.
H.F. Young	\$14.99 10-12' tall / Blooms May-June & Sept. / Pruning group 2. True mid-blue 7-8" blooms with overlapping petals. Cream anthers, very free flowering.
Huldini	\$14.99 12-20' tall / Blooms July-October / Pruning group 3. Medium sized flowers of white to 4" across valued for its profusion of flowers late in the season. Very vigorous and shade tolerant.
Ines	\$14.99 4' tall / Blooms June-August & Sept. / Pruning group 2. Lavender blue blooms to 4" across have a faint red bar. The star shaped blooms occur for most of the summer on short vines.
Jackmanii	\$14.99 10-12' tall / Blooms June-July & Sept. / Pruning group 3. Dark purple blooms 5-6" across. An old vigorous variety dating back before the civil war. Easy to grow.
Killian Donahue	\$14.99 8-10' tall / Blooms June through September / Pruning group 2. Bicolor blooms of deep fuchsia with mauve-pink edges up to 5" wide. Established plants under good culture bloom for most of the summer.
Mrs. N. Thompson	\$14.99 7-8' tall / Blooms May-June, September / Pruning group 2. 5-6" deep blue blooms with a contrasting scarlet bar in each petal.
Multi-Blue	\$14.99 7-8' tall / Blooms June & September / Pruning group 2. Very double blooms of deep violet-blue 4-5" across. Fall blooms are single.
Nelly Moser	\$14.99 8-12' tall / Blooms May-June & August-Sept. / Pruning group 2. Pale pink 5-6" blooms with a deeper pink center. Tolerates shade well.
Niobe	\$14.99 6-8' tall / Blooms June & August-Sept. / Pruning group 2. Large 6-8", dark magenta-red with pointed petals and contrasting gold anthers. One of the very best reds.
Olympia	\$14.99 3-5' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 2 or 3. 4-5" Blue blooms that are mostly single with yellow anthers are produced abundantly from new growth on short bushy vines.
Paniculata (terniflora)	\$14.99 10-20' tall / Blooms in August, September / Pruning group 3. Very vigorous grower with clusters of small white fragrant flowers. Also known as the sweet autumn clematis. Tolerates light shade.
Paulie	\$14.99 3-5' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 3. 4" Abundant purple flowers with a magenta stripe through each petal. Short and free flowering.
Picardy	\$14.99 4' tall / Blooms June-August / Pruning group 2. Free flowering reddish-purple 4" flowers on short vines.
Piilu	\$14.99 6' tall / Blooms May, July and September / Pruning group 2. 5" Blooms are double light pink with darker pink centers. Single blooms are produced later in the season.
Ramona	\$14.99 6' tall / Blooms July-August & Sept. / Pruning group 2. 5-7" blooms of lilac-blue. Heat tolerant

Rhapsody	\$14.99 8' tall / Blooms July-September / Pruning group 3. Free flowering with 4-5" sapphire blue petals that deepen with age. Creamy-yellow anthers, very free flowering
Rosalie	\$14.99 7' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 3. 5" flowers of two-toned rose pink. Thick petals fade to many pink shades as new ones keep pushing on.
Sarah Elizabeth	\$14.99 3-4' tall / Blooms May-October / Pruning group 3. 5-6" blooms are a light, bright clear pink. Short, free blooming plants are worth growing in shade.
Snow Queen	\$14.99 6-10' tall / Blooms May-June & August / Pruning group 2. Huge single white blooms with burgundy anthers.
Sunset	\$14.99 8-10' tall / Blooms May through September / Pruning group 2. Long blooming selection with glowing fuchsia-red 5-7" blooms with purple edges. Vigorous grower.
Taiga	\$14.99 6-8' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 3. 4-6" double blooms mature lavender blue. It was initially believed this free bloomer was best for the south, yet has proven hardy to at least ten below 0.
The President	\$14.99 8-12' tall / Blooms June-September / Pruning group 2. Large single deep blue-purple flowers to 8" across. Established plants bloom for months at a time. Considered one of the best blues.
Tranquilite	\$14.99 4-5' tall / Blooms May-September / Pruning group 3. 4-5" blooms of pale lilac blue on short vines. Worth growing in the shade.
Westerplatte	\$14.99 8' tall / Blooms June -Sept. / Pruning group 2. Rich velvety red blooms to 5" across, free blooming habit

- Pruning groups:**
- 1) This group only blooms on previous year's wood, so only prune immediately after blooming
 - 2) Only remove any dead material in early spring as it becomes evident, otherwise prune to size
 - 3) This group blooms later from new growth, prune down near to the ground

Clematis Culture: Clematis need a location with at least 5-6 hours of good sunlight. Some varieties thrive in less. Clematis roots are long and deep and like it cool and damp, but not soggy. They prefer a light weight mulch around their base to moderate temperature. When planting loosen the soil to a depth of 2 feet, mix the soil with peat moss and well-rotted manure. Failure to do so may result in a stunted plant that may never reach its potential. Plant your clematis so it is 1-2" deeper than the original soil level of the pot. Pruning your clematis down to 12 inches after the 1st year will result in a bushier plant. Clematis appreciate an organic balanced fertilizer in early spring as buds swell. Avoid non-organic foods as clematis resent elemental nitrogen standing around the roots, usually causing outright death of young plants.
