

ORNAMENTAL VINES

2021

Varieties, description and culture.....



- American Porcelainberry** **New** \$39.99 / *Ampelopsis cordata* / 25'+ tall / A grape relative with similar, smallish light green leaves. Small fruits ripen in late summer turning pink before turning dark purple. Can take considerable shade.
- Carolina Jessamine** \$11.99 / *Gelsemium sempervirens 'Margarita'* / To 10'+ tall / Sun/part sun / Vigorous vine with fragrant yellow trumpet-shaped flowers from April-May, semi-evergreen glossy leaves. Gold medal winner from the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society. Tolerates deer and drought.
- Climbing Hydrangea** \$61.99 / *Hydrangea petiolaris* / to 25'+ tall / Full sun or light shade / Relatively slow growing deciduous clinging vine grown for its flat white clusters born in June. Works well on a brick wall or as a ground cover. Eventually forms a layered look with ornamental peeling bark. Takes several years or more to bloom reliably. Pots sold from the nursery.
- Cross Vine** \$39.99 / *Bignonia capreolata* / To 30' tall / Full sun / Native semi-evergreen clinging vine. In late spring bears 2in long fragrant trumpet shaped blooms that are redish-brown outside and yellow-orange inside. Prefers good soil and moisture although quite tolerant when established.
- Honeysuckle, Coral** \$11.99 / *Lonicera sempervirens 'Major Wheeler'* / Like the above only with flowers that are more red and with shiny green, mildew-resistant foliage. Blooms more so in waves with short rests.
- Honeysuckle, Hybrid** \$11.99 / *Lonicera x heckrottii 'Gold Flame'* / 10-20' tall / Carmine red buds open to gold centers, very faint fragrance, sterile hybrid produces no unwanted seedlings, almost always showing color,
- Honeysuckle, Late Dutch** \$12.99 / *Lonicera periclymenum 'Scentsation'* / To 8-12' tall / Sun or part shade / The larger than normal blooms of white quickly turn bright yellow. The blooms occur over an extended period from late May-August, followed by red berries in the fall. Very fragrant. A PW colorchoice plant
- Honeysuckle, Limber** **New** \$39.99 / *Lonicera dioica* / 10'+ tall / Clusters of light yellow flowers in May-June are followed by red berries. Handsome eucalyptus-like waxy foliage. Chiefly pollinated by hummingbirds, Indiana native.
- Honeysuckle, Trumpet** \$11.99 / *Lonicera x brownii 'Dropmore scarlet'* / 10-20' tall / Very floriferous ever blooming variety with solid orange trumpet-shaped flower clusters from June-Oct. A good grower but manageable due to its shrubby habit. Semi-evergreen, no fragrance.
- Hops Vine 'Galena'** \$5.99 / *Humulus lupulus* / To 20' tall / A fast growing herbaceous (Dying back to the ground each winter) vine used to brew beer that also makes a low maintenance ornamental with handsome foliage and refreshing green panicles in late summer. Give plenty of space. 'Galena' (Bittering and Aroma)
- Passionflower, Hardy** \$9.99 / *Passiflora incarnata* / 15' tall / Sun to mostly sun / An informal native herbaceous vine with mitten-like foliage. Exotic 3" multicolor blooms July-Sept. Late to sprout in the spring. A.k.a. Maypop Vine. Late spring.
- Silver Lace Vine** \$11.99 / *Polygonum aubretii* / 30' tall / Sun or mostly sun / Vigorous deciduous woody twining vine with masses of white fragrant frothy clusters in summer. Blooms on new growth of the season, give space.
- Trumpet Vine, Orange** **New** \$39.99 / *Campsis radicans 'Minnesota Red'* / To 30' tall+ / Full to mostly sun / Large scarlet clusters occur from July-September. Vigorous vine, may take several years to bloom well.
- Trumpet Vine, Orange** \$11.99 / *Campsis x tagliabuana 'Madame Galen'* / To 30' tall+ / Full to mostly sun / Vigorous deciduous clinging vine. Large, orange-red trumpet-shaped blooms with a hint of salmon bloom June-September. This variety blooms at a young age. Also known as the hummingbird vine.
- Virginia Creeper** \$15.99 / *Parthenocissus quinquefolia 'Red Wall'* / To 30'+ tall / Full sun for best fall color / An easy to grow native vine ideal for covering masonry and buildings. Deciduous woody clinging habit. Weeping leaflets grow relatively close to its structure. A Proven Winners selection that turns red in the fall.
- Wisteria, Kentucky** \$11.99 / *Wisteria macrostachys 'Blue Moon'* / 25'+tall / Sun to mostly sun / Deciduous native vine with sweetly-scented display of 8-12" long lilac-purple clusters, reblooming up to 2-3 times a year. Blooms first or second year from planting and established plants may bloom 3 times a year. Tolerates more moisture than other wisteria

Vine Culture: Most vines grow and bloom best in sun or mostly sun. All do their best with moist but well drained soil. Other than the initial establishment phase, nitrogen fertilizer is typically best avoided with most vines as it encourages lush rampant growth at the expense

of the flowers. Some vines may take several years to bloom. Campsis, Climbing Hydrangea and Wisteria are examples. In the wild, when these vines reach a treetop and have nowhere else to go but sideways, the flowering hormones are then produced. By pruning back vigorous upward top growth regularly and training on a horizontal support, flowering can occur earlier.

- Bittersweet, American** **\$32.99** / *Celastrus scandens 'Autumn Revolution'* / 25+ tall / Sun or part sun / Fast growing native twining vine with persistent orange/scarlet fruit ripening in the fall. Can grow quite tall, depending on its structure. This variety is a self-pollinating female with larger than usual fruit.
- Dutchmen's Pipe** **\$19.99** / *Aristolochia durior* / To 20' tall / Sun or light shade / Deciduous twining woody vine with curious green and maroon pipe shaped blooms in late spring. Makes a vigorous dense screen and tolerates shade.
- Honeysuckle, Grape 'Kintzley's Ghost'** **\$15.99** / *Lonicera reticulata* / To 8-12' tall / Sun or part shade / A rare heirloom native honeysuckle with slightly fragrant clusters of bright yellow flowers in late spring which are backdropped by large showy silvery white bracts which remain showy till a hard freeze. Compact.
- Honeysuckle, Hybrid** **\$10.99** / *Lonicera x 'Mandarin'* / 10-20' tall / Leaves emerge purple-bronze in spring, mellowing to green in summer. Blaze orange and yellow blooms occur in spring.
- Trumpet Vine, Yellow** **\$11.99** / *Campsis radicans 'Flava'* / To 30+ tall / Full sun / Vigorous native deciduous clinging vine. Clusters of bright yellow trumpet-shaped flowers born in summer. May take a few or more years to establish and bloom. Avoid nitrogen fertilizer as it may delay bloom.
- Sweet Pea, Perennial** **\$11.99** / *Lathyrus latifolius* / 4-8' tall / Full sun or partial sun / Adaptable herbaceous clinging vine needing little more than well-drained soil. Also works as a groundcover for poor rocky soils. Blooms are either rose red, various shades of pink or white that occur summer to early autumn.
